Stranded / floating and already dead?

Unless large numbers found dead, leave in place. If in a public place and causing problems, then remove the bird wearing suitable protective clothing and gloves and bag and bin it.

Jellyfish

Alive but stranded

Unlikely to be able to save jellyfish which has been stranded. Leave in place. It is not unusual for large numbers of small jellyfish to wash up on beach.

Unusual Sightings e.g. lots of big White 'Barrel' Jellyfish / or Lions Mane or Portuguese Man O War

Warn Swimmers if it's a stinging jellyfish. For unusual sightings contact the **Marine Conservation Society** 01989 566017
